Restoration of the Slappy Building continues to move ever closer to completion thanks to Jacky Dodson and his crew. The brick work was hand cut and individually placed to return it to it's historic beauty. Watch for more to come!

#### **Havana Museum Renovation Underway**

The Havana History Museum is pleased and proud to an announce the recent completion in June of Phase 1 of our restoration effort the reroofing of the fertilizer tower. The tower houses a three story vertical mill which was installed in 1948 and featured a state of the art machinery for the time. During the late 40's & 50's this mill produced about 10,000 tons of shade tobacco fertilizer each year, approximately 75-80% of the total fertilizer used by the entire regional market, Plans for the tower include using it to tell the story of The Planters Exchange and its impact in Gadsden County and the surrounding community.

Thanks to the ongoing support from our community, Phase 2, the Re-Roofing of the adjacent fertilizer room, is scheduled to be completed before Christmas. Focusing on raising funds Phases 3&4, the total cost of the completed project will be \$133,500.00.
