The fall festival schedule brought record breaking numbers, fresh ideas and happy faces to guests and merchants. Starting in September the streets of Havana were full of activity.

September 3rd, saw the **First Annual Wood Fest**. The juried art festival, brought wood workers from across the area to display and sell their wares. There were demonstrations of wood turning from the Tallahassee Wood Turners and reknown chainsaw carver John Birch.

October 8th, saw record breaking crowds come to town. Over 6,000 people came to enjoy the fun, food and family activities of **Pumpkin Fest**. More than 80 vendors filled the streets with everything from fine crafts to bubble guns.

November was a triple header. The much anticipated **Annual Quilt Show** was November 5, hosted by Havana Springs Resort in the beautiful 1908 Events Venue, over 100 handmade quilts were on display and sale. Thanks to **Wendy Adams** and her Quilting Crew, proceeds from the day long event went provide funds for Havana Main Street events. **November 12th** was the **Annual Havana Holiday Open House Celebration**. A Shopping Spree Give Away made several winning customers holiday shopping that much easier. The lighting of the community Christmas Tree and the arrival of **Santa Claus** by fire truck was the official kick off

of the Holiday Season in Havana, the stores were dressed and the town looked incredible with all the lights on the downtown trees, Christmas Card Lane is growing with new panels and the stockings were hung on the light posts with care!

The **AHA Gallery** debuted their **First Annual AHA-liday Event**. Staying open every Saturday and two Fridays, more than 30 artists sold their work. The sale was deemed a success and AHA plans to be open every Saturday through February to see what the market supports.

Crowning the season on **December 10th** was **An-nual Havana WinterFest and Lawn mower Pa-rade**. Once again vendors filled the streets, talent filled the stage hosted by the Grinch himself, aka Exit Smith. The jewel in the crown as always is the arrival of **SNOW** to Havana. Children and adults as well were able to experience the chilling plea-sure of playing in the snow. The parade had a re-cord number of entrants. There were step dancing crew from the Magnet School, a marching band, antique cars, an Ice Cream cart and of course, the beloved Lawn mowers.

Not to mention the behind the scenes support provided by the City of Havana's Utility and Street Crews, the Havana Police Department and the Volunteer Fire Department.
